especially during Christmas—often means living between two cultures.

Many of us who grew up or moved to Canada were encouraged to adjust quickly and embrace the culture here. That can be great in many ways, but it can also mean slowly losing touch with the stories and traditions we come from.

Pamasko Tales was created to help fill that gap. It's more than just a holiday show. It's a project that puts Filipino stories front and centre—something we don't often see on professional stages in Manitoba, even though Filipinos make up such a large part of the community.

The show brings Filipino folklore to life in a fresh, modern way. By putting our myths, humour, and traditions onstage, **Pamasko Tales** reminds us that our stories deserve to stand alongside the holiday classics everyone already knows. It's one way UNIT hopes to highlight the Filipino experience in the diaspora and make sure our narratives are recognized as an important part of Canada's culture.

A Cultural Movement, Not Just a Show

At its core, **Pamasko Tales** is really about cultural reclamation. It brings back myths and legends that were pushed aside or forgotten because of colonial history. Through fun, immersive storytelling, audiences get to experience old tales about nature, the stars, spirits, water, and the other forces our ancestors once believed in. By reimagining these stories for the stage, the show does more than entertain—it helps us remember where we come from, sparks pride, and creates meaningful connections across generations.

We want **Pamasko Tales** to become something families look forward to every year—a holiday tradition built around our own stories. A show where Filipino tales are celebrated, shared, and made just as recognizable and beloved as the holiday staples we usually see.

ABOUT UNIT

U N I T (You and I Together) Productions is a transdisciplinary company dedicated to creating culturally dynamic content rooted in Filipino-Canadian stories.

Founded in 2016 by Hazel Venzon and David Oro, **UNIT** produces live art events, performance art, plays, musicals, graphic novels, films, documentaries, and hybrid entertainment. Originally conceived as a multidisciplinary producing company, **UNIT** shifted its focus after touring its first project, **The Places We Go** (Tacloban Philippines), recognizing the need to highlight Filipino narratives in Winnipeg. By 2019, **UNIT** evolved into a service organization offering mentorship, dramaturgy, and production support to Filipino and POC writers, creators, and emerging artists. Guided by human connection and equity, **UNIT** leads with creativity, emotional intelligence, and a commitment to exploration and growth. Its work centers on supporting the Filipino community and bringing underrepresented stories into the mainstream.



Over years of reflection and community engagement, **UNIT** has solidified its role within Winnipeg's vibrant arts scene as a catalyst for diverse artistic talent. Its mission bridges cultural storytelling with professional development, equipping artists with the tools, mentorship, and platforms needed to thrive.

At the heart of **UNIT**'s work is the creation of spaces where artists can explore identity, heritage, and community through innovative and inclusive programming. In 2025, **UNIT** introduces two cornerstone initiatives—the **PAGBUO Workshop Series** and **PAMASKO Tales**—which anchor its sustainable model for artistic development and cultural storytelling. These programs provide essential opportunities for Filipino-Canadian and POC artists to grow, connect, and create.

Playwright's Notes

When Hazel first presented me with the Ibong Adarna story, I had vague memories of watching a rented Filipino movie on Betamax with my parents. A dove-like bird pooped on a spellbound prince who was transformed into a sleeping statue. I didn't understand Tagalog, but I remember the visceral reaction of the whole family laughing and gagging at the same time.

As I read more of Ibong Adarna, I saw a story where parents place expectations on their children, in hopes of shaping their futures and eventually their own legacies. Growing up Filipino, I still feel the weight of the expectations my parents placed upon me, the entirety of their immigrant search for a better life heavy on my shoulders, crushing my dreams of one day becoming a writer. Fortunately, I inherited my mother's Filipina stubbornness; I persevered and found my way to tell my stories.

I wrote The Glitter Bird with as many layers as a Halo Halo. I wrote a fun and silly story for the young kids with enough meta jokes and clever punchlines to satisfy the older ones. There's nostalgia for the Lolo's and Lola's and enough bops across genres that will have everyone humming the songs weeks from now. I've also added a not-so-subtle message for the parents, the ones like me who need to lighten that load that our parents handed to us. While we also want what's best for our children, we must take away the weight of our expectations so they will be able to fly.

Thank you to Hazel and UNIT Productions for this opportunity to write a modern Filipino fairy tale by pulling from my memories, covering them with glitter and setting them in stone. Thank you to our #glittergang, the immensely talented cast and crew. We have created something beautiful with a universal message that will break boundaries and spark joy.

Thank you to my family for all your support. As always, thank you to my husband, Josh, for your patience and proof-reading skills. Thank you to my son, Jericho, for helping me navigate song choices. Above all, thank you to Silas, my sounding board and my inspiration. Your insightful questions, your contagious giggle, and your unique point of view helped me create this story. You are my Musika. I look forward to the stories you will write one day.

Director's Notes

Growing up, my bedroom wasn't really a place for sleeping—it was a theatre. Looking back, it was where I built entire worlds, where my toys became characters and the stories I invented filled a part of me I didn't yet know would become my career. With my bedroom door firmly shut, I'd spend hours talking out loud, entertaining my dolls, and rearranging the furniture to match whatever scene I was imagining. The clothes in my closet became curtains, the headboard a backstage, and the bed itself was the stage. The door stayed closed mostly out of fear of getting caught not studying!

Now, much, much older, I keep the door open when I play. I let my imagination be something to share and celebrate. In many ways, I've been directing since I was young, and in this production, you'll catch glimpses of that youthful spirit that still pushes me to tell stories. I hope you'll feel your own younger self spark to life—entertained by the young people on stage and by the community gathered around you.

It has been a true pleasure and honour to direct this performance for you, our audience. Working with this incredibly talented company: playwright, composer, designer, musicians, cast and production team has been so fulfilling. They've poured their artistry into making sure you have the best first experience inside the world of our special production.

On behalf of all of us, I hope you enjoy the very first Pamasko Tales production with The Glitter Bird under Primrose's glitter-pen. I hope you feel our shared histories shimmering through this sparkly version of Ibong Adarna - faaaaar from what you would ever imagine it could be - and created by a fully Filipino artistic team, cast and production crew—showcasing who we are when we come together and create live theatre.

Musical Arrangement and Director


